SUBJECT: COVID-19

LOCAL RISK FACTOR: HIGH

POSITIVE COVID-19 CASES: The City of Saint Paul is pleased to report no new cases of COVID-19 have been reported to the City on Friday, June 17, 2022.

TOTAL POSITIVE CASES TO DATE: Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic Saint Paul Island has had or has 150 individuals that have tested positive for COVID-19.

ACTIVE POSITIVE CASES: As of today, Saint Paul Island has 36 active COVID-19 cases.

FATHER'S DAY WEEKEND: Happy Father's Day to all the fathers. With Father's Day weekend upon us and so many active COVID-19 cases it is all of our responsibility as we gather with family and friends to make sure that the virus does not continue to spread in our community. Here is what you can do to help stop the spread:

- If you have tested positive in the last 10 days stay home and do not visit family or friends until you test negative.
- If you are a close contact within the past 5 days of a positive individual stay home and do not visit family or friends.
- If you are not a close contact or recently tested positive for COVID-19 take a COVID-19 test prior to gathering with family or friends.

COVID-19 PREVENTIVE MEASURES: Wash Your Hands, Wear a Mask in Indoor Public Spaces, Watch For Symptoms, Stay Health, Vaccinate.

GET TESTED IF YOU ARE SICK: If are feeling ill or sick no matter how minor the symptoms get tested for COVID-19. Contact the Saint Paul Health Center during normal business hours to arrange to get tested. Additionally, if you are feeling sick stay home from school or work.

GET VACCINATED AND BOOSTED: To protect yourself and others against COVID-19 if eligible get vaccinated and boosted.

COVID-19 TESTING: COVID-19 testing is readily available on Saint Paul Island. Contact Public Safety at 907-546-3130 to pick up test kits or to schedule a time to get tested. Please make sure to send your test results to snpcovid19@stpaulak.com.
