SUBJECT: COVID-19

LOCAL RISK FACTOR: MEDIUM

POSITIVE COVID-19 CASES: The City of Saint Paul was informed 1 additional resident tested positive for COVID-19 on Friday, November 4, 2022.

PER CITY EMERGENCY ORDINANCE 22-99:

- Positive individuals shall isolate for 10 days and wear a well-fitted mask for 10 days while around others.
- Close contacts of the positive individual shall quarantine for 5 days, monitor for symptoms for 10 days and wear a well-fitted mask for 10 days while around others.

TOTAL POSITIVE CASES TO DATE: Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic Saint Paul Island has had 180 individuals that have tested positive for COVID-19.

ACTIVE POSITIVE CASES: As of today, Saint Paul Island has 5 active COVID-19 cases.

COVID-19 PREVENTIVE MEASURES: Wash Your Hands, Wear a Mask in Indoor Public Spaces, Watch For Symptoms, Stay Health, Vaccinate.

COMMUNITY SPREAD OF COVID-19: Community spread of COVID-19 is highly likely. Keep your social circle small. Get teste if you are not feeling well.

GET TESTED IF YOU ARE SICK: If are feeling ill or sick no matter how minor the symptoms get tested for COVID-19. Additionally, if you are feeling sick stay home from school or work.

GET VACCINATED AND BOOSTED: To protect yourself and others against COVID-19 if eligible get vaccinated and boosted.
