**SUBJECT:** COVID-19

**LOCAL RISK FACTOR:** MEDIUM

**POSITIVE COVID-19 CASES:** The City of Saint Paul was informed on Thursday, November 10, 2022 that 1 resident tested positive for COVID-19 on Wednesday, November 9, 2022.

**PER CITY EMERGENCY ORDINANCE 22-99:**

- Positive individuals shall isolate for 10 days and wear a well-fitted mask for 10 days while around others.
- Close contacts of the positive individual shall quarantine for 5 days, monitor for symptoms for 10 days and wear a well-fitted mask for 10 days while around others.

**TOTAL POSITIVE CASES TO DATE:** Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic Saint Paul Island has had 182 individuals that have tested positive for COVID-19.

**ACTIVE POSITIVE CASES:** As of today, Saint Paul Island has 6 active COVID-19 cases.

**COVID-19 PREVENTIVE MEASURES:** Wash Your Hands, Wear a Mask in Indoor Public Spaces, Watch For Symptoms, Stay Health, Vaccinate.

**COMMUNITY SPREAD OF COVID-19:** Community spread of COVID-19 is highly likely. Keep your social circle small. Get teste if you are not feeling well.

**GET TESTED IF YOU ARE SICK:** If are feeling ill or sick no matter how minor the symptoms get tested for COVID-19. Additionally, if you are feeling sick stay home from school or work.

**GET VACCINATED AND BOOSTED:** To protect yourself and others against COVID-19 if eligible get vaccinated and boosted.
